## Roy F. Stevens

The life of Roy F. Stevens spanned the history of the Church of the Nazarene both longitudinally and horizontally. Born in a Nazarene preacher's home and educated at Olivet Nazarene College, his service to the church came through teaching, pastoring, and serving on college boards. Dr. Stevens served for ten years as District Superintendent of the Minnesota District. During this time he was a member of N.N.C.'s Board of Regents and served nearly two years as the chairman. This he resigned as he assumed leadership of the Kansas City District.

Talented musician and singer, successful college teacher and church pastor, efficient administrator, faithful churchman, loving husband and father, Dr. Roy F. Stevens was always a courteous cultured Christian gentleman.


## Joseph E. Janosky










## Oasis


