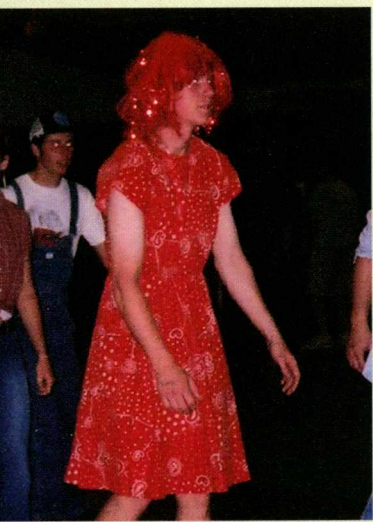

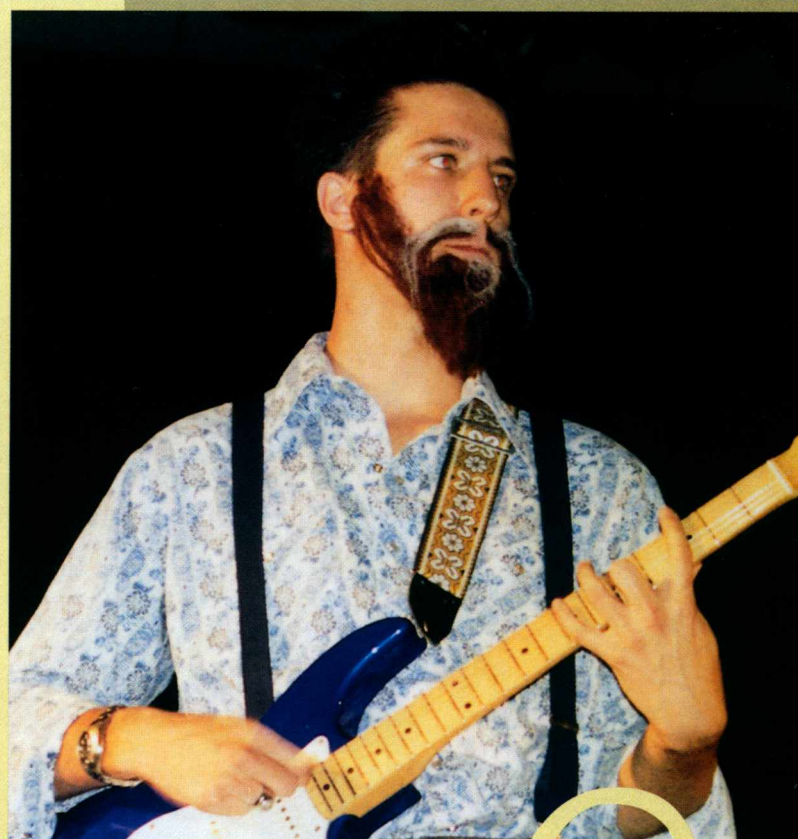

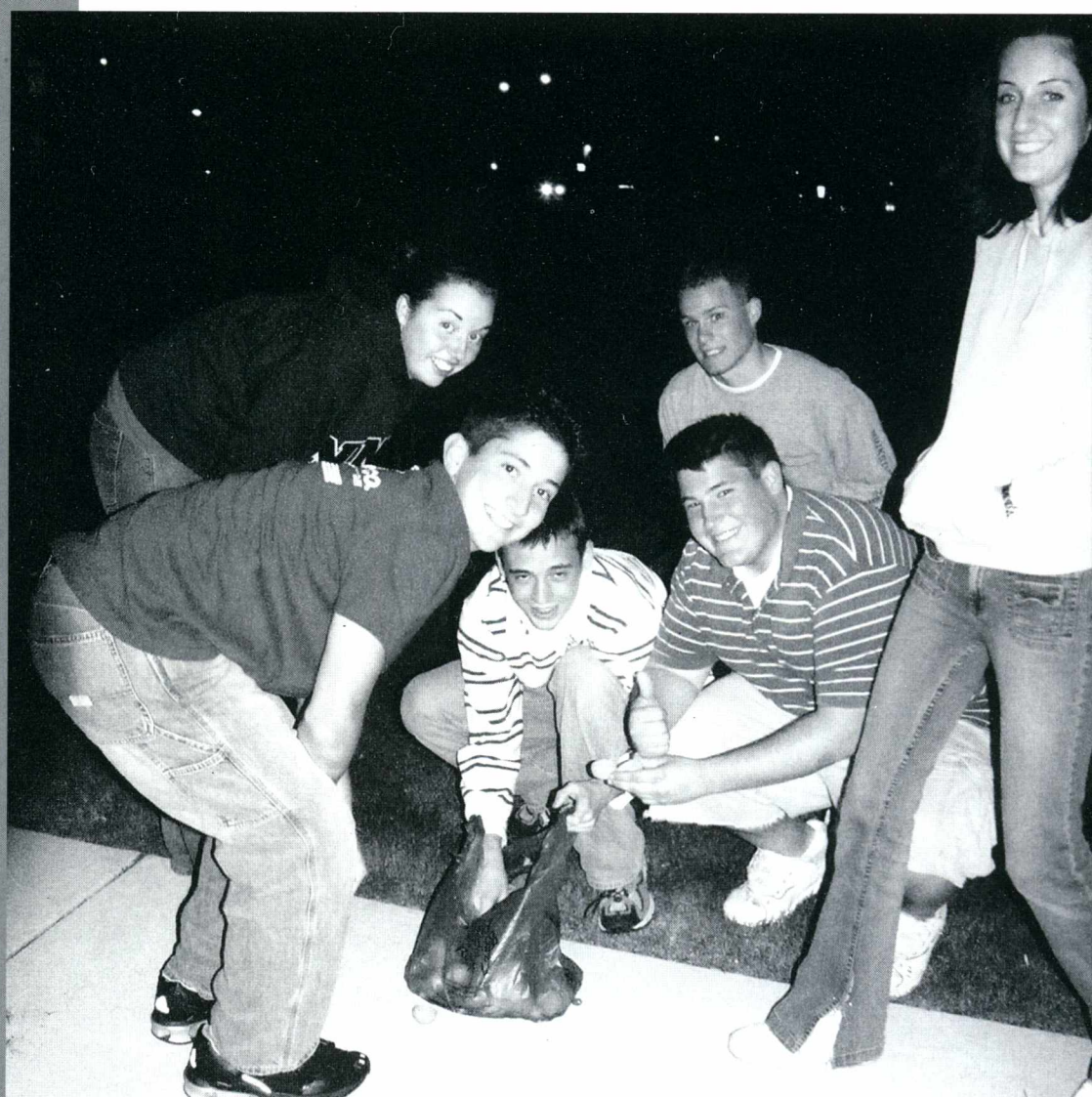
Easter NNU

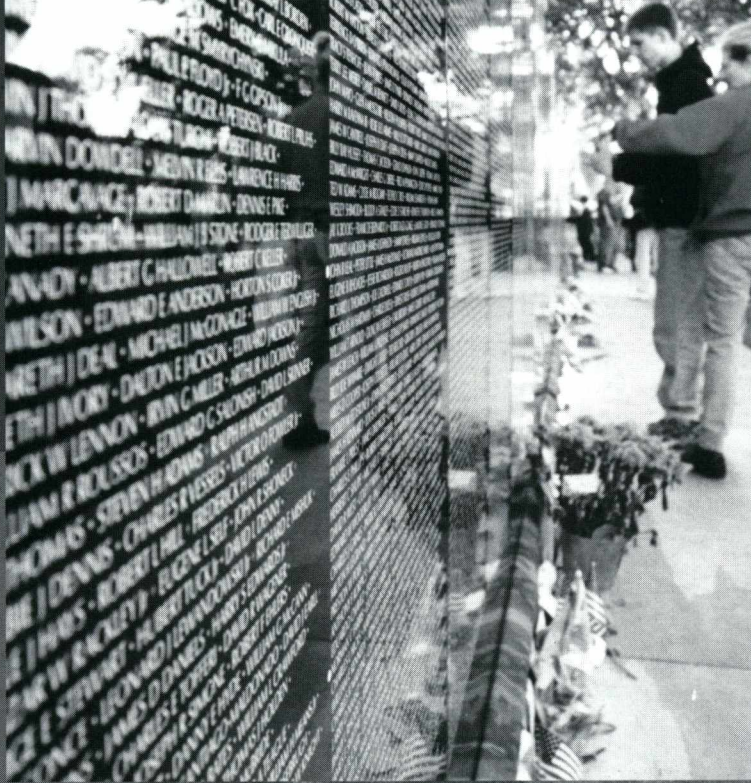

Thousands came to pay their respects to those who served. Tears were shed and memories relived as many traced the names that engrave the wall. Our campus was the proud host of the Vietnam Memorial Moving Wall. Northwest Nazarene University was transformed in an atmosphere of celebration and of remembrance for the week. The Moving Wall also known as "The Wall That Heals," is a half-scale replica, exact to the letter and inch, of the original memorial in the nation's capital. It contains the names of the 58,202 military personnel dead or missing in Vietnam in chronological order from 1959 to 1975. What an opportunity the students and community was blessed with to have such a national tribute on our very own campus. Those who served will never be forgotten, forever engraved on our hearts.

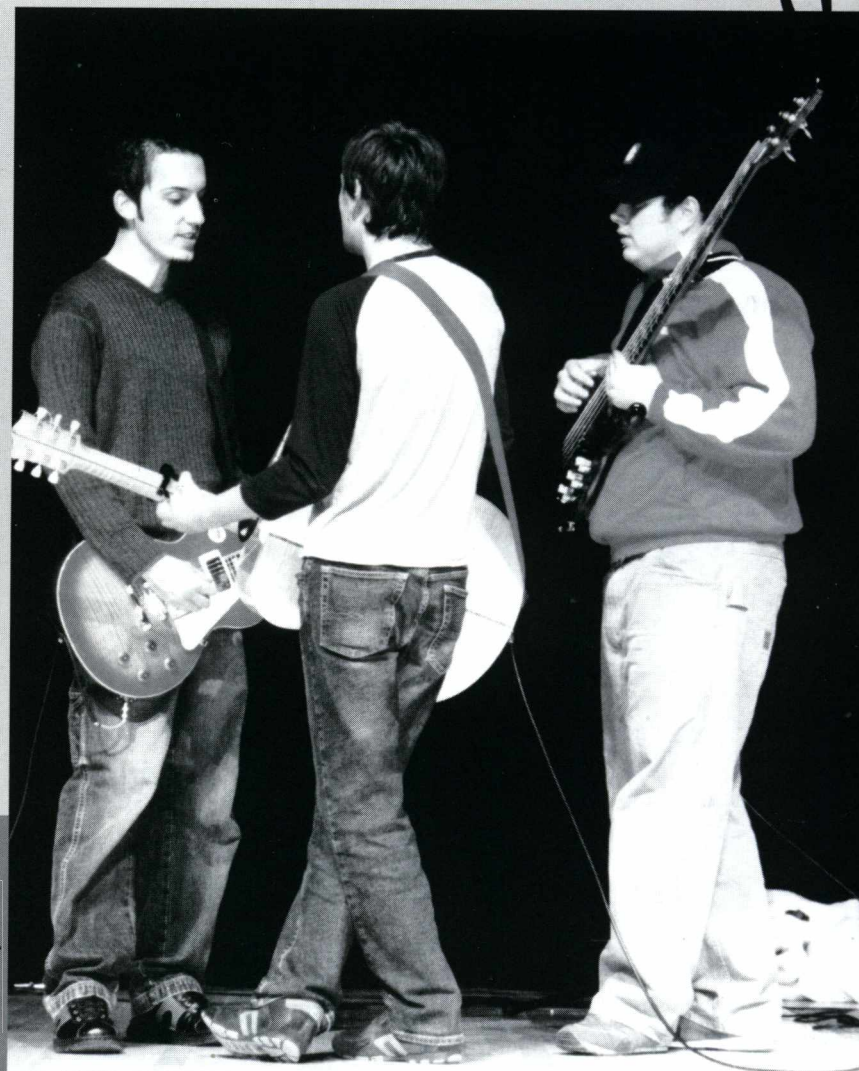

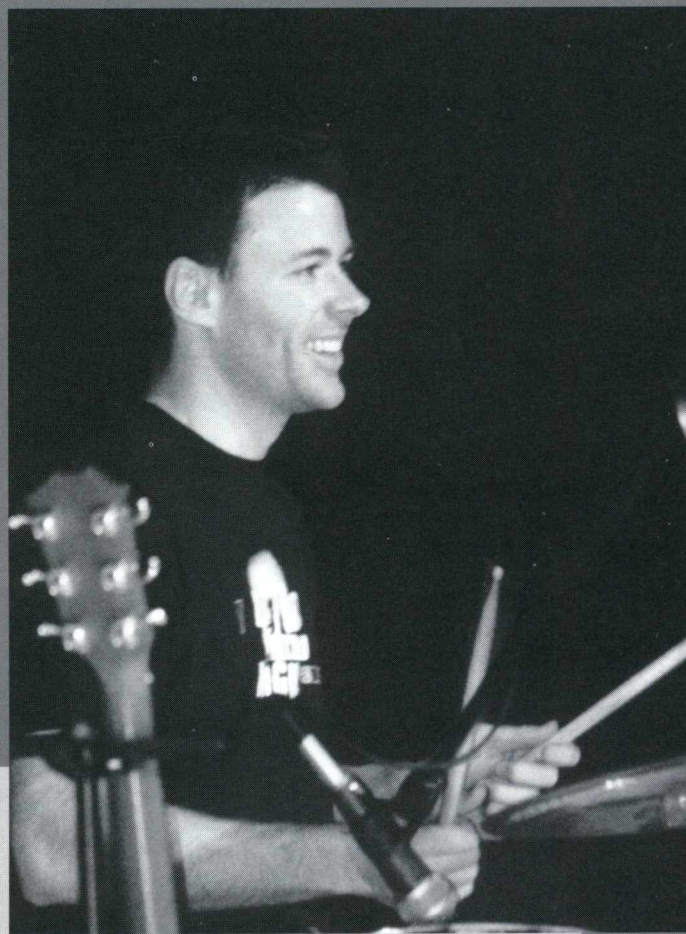

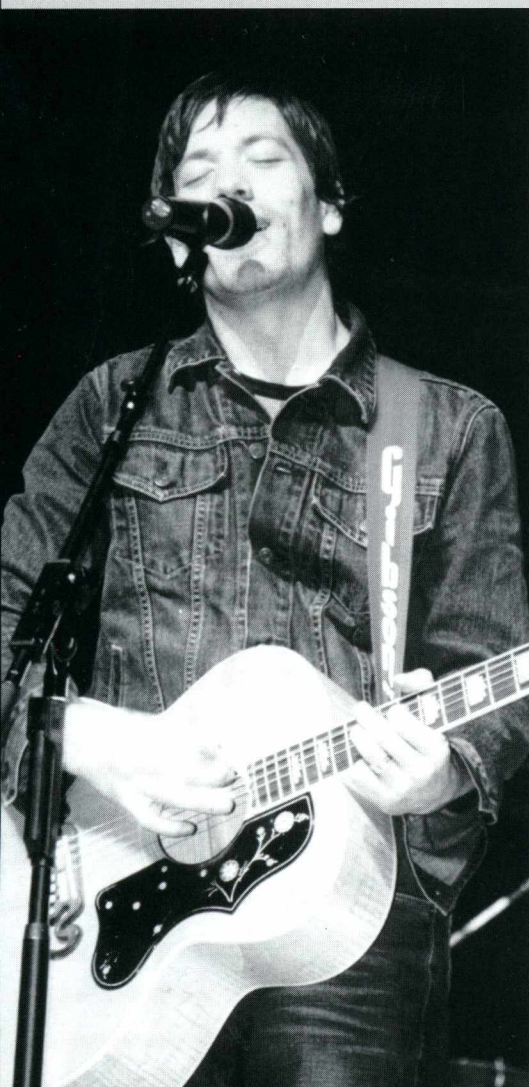

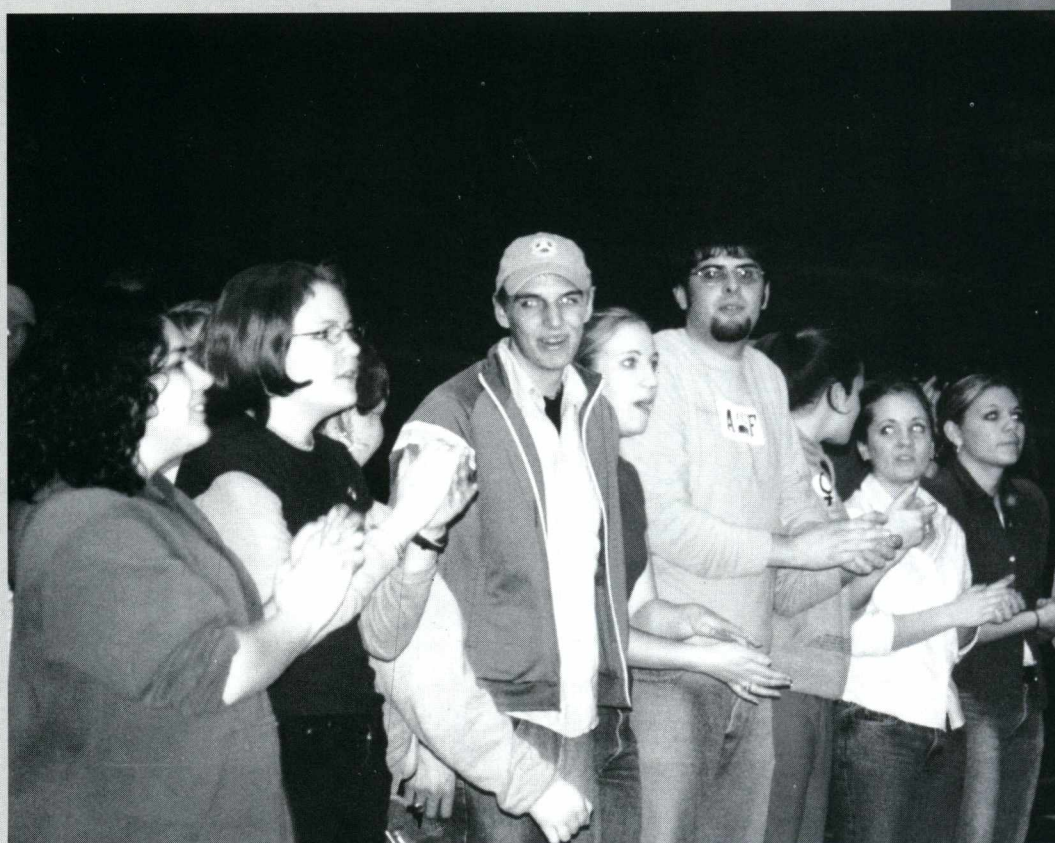

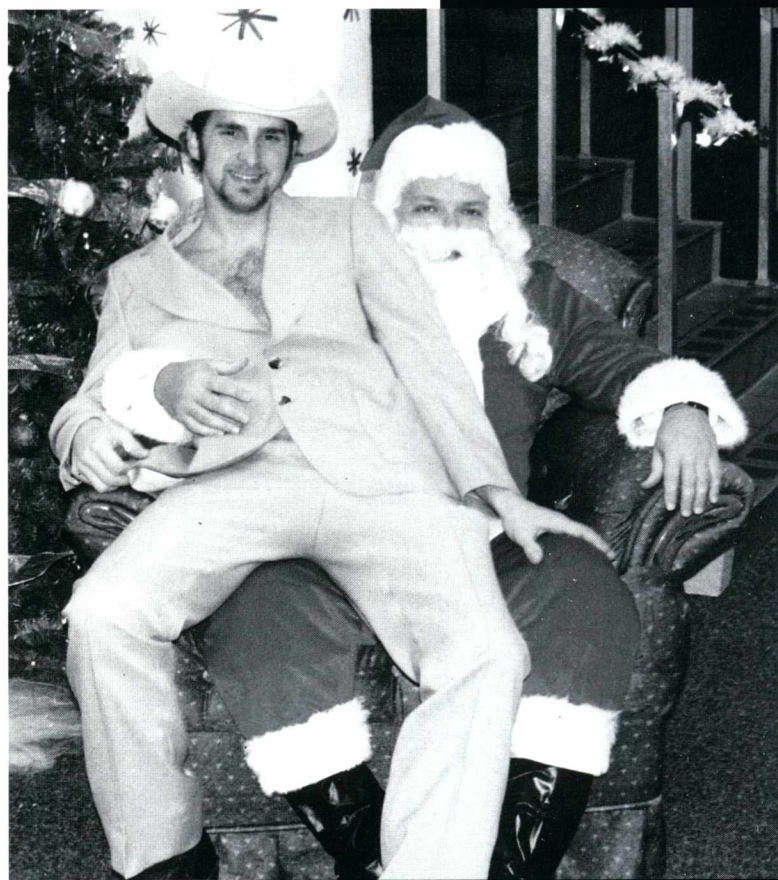
NNU's ^{own} coffeedhouse @ Amity Perk

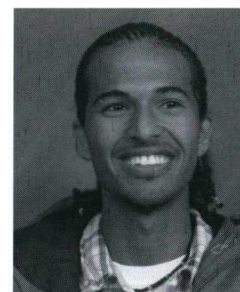
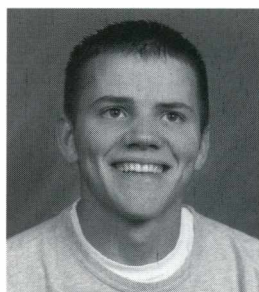
Junior year is different from sophomore and freshman year because of the amount of freedom the students are given and the number of new opportunities and experi-

Faculty Retirement Update written by: Dr. Mark Pitts, Vice President for Academic Affairs

Newell Morgan

Dr. Newell Morgan—professor, compassionate adult, host to international students, pastor, hunter, horseman, and cowboy—began his connection with Northwest Nazarene University as a student here from 1961 to 1965. Since that time, he has dedicated much of his life to his work at NNU, and to the community.

Dr. Morgan has been an engaged and dedicated teacher; he has been a faculty member at NNU since 1975 and served as chair of the Modern Languages Department. He has given careful service to University committees, with special emphasis on committees planning outreach into the community.

He has been a compassionate friend and champion of students, especially international students, and those interested in international experiences; he and his wife have provided free room and board to countless international students at NNU. He has led a number of work and mission trips for the University. He has, for a time, co-pastored a Spanish-language Nazarene church in the area. He has been a friend and advocate of members of the Spanish-speaking community.

He has also been an enthusiastic promoter of outdoor Idaho; he has arranged countless trips on his own string of quarter horses for faculty and community members for purposes of hunting and enjoyment of parts of Idaho far from any sign of human habitation.

Dr. Jim Willis, his college roommate and longtime friend writes, "...I have seen the Christian spirit of caring and loving displayed and lived out in Newell Morgan. Newell has never said no to any request that included working with NNU students."

As this chapter in his life closes, another one opens. Dr. Morgan will expand his horseshoeing business, and continue to build saddles, and to raise and train horses.

Jim and Judith Stocks

The University has been blessed in the last four years by the work and the lives of Drs. Jim and Judith Stocks, who have submitted letters of resignation and announced their plans to retire at the end of the year. Dr. Judith Stocks has served as the founding chair of the NNU Nursing program, leading the development of coursework, and the recruitment of faculty and students. The program has already developed a statewide reputation for excellence. In an unprecedented affirmation, the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, the nursing accrediting agency, granted the NNU program full accreditation in its first year. Dr. Stocks' work with Admissions and Marketing has established the nursing major as a "program of choice" for students at NNU. She has formed connections with local hospitals which have resulted in on-going grants in support of departmental operations.

Her work in state-wide nursing education circles has built an atmosphere of cooperation and support among nursing programs in the area.

Jim Stocks has served as a highly effective Director of Church Resource Services, and an example of the commitment of the University to being a "Church Grant Institution" which sees meaningful service and assistance to the congregations and districts in the Northwest Educational Region of the Church of the Nazarene as one of its key priorities. During his time at NNU, Jim became the prime mover in what has grown into a complex of initiatives through the School of Theology and Christian ministries as well as initiatives from other sectors of NNU, including a system of graduate and continuing education for clergy and laity, resources to assist pastors with planning and problem-solving, promotion of camaraderie and collaboration between constituents and NNU, and offering spiritual, intellectual, social support to ministers in their service to God and the Kingdom. Jim and Judith will spend partial time at family homes in Alabama and South Carolina, and be involved in the care of their parents.

Darryl Wenner

Dr. Darryl Wenner is a graduate of NNC, receiving his undergraduate degree in 1969. He completed a Masters Degree at Arizona State University and began his career as a faculty member in the English Department at Northwest Nazarene University in 1974. He has done advanced preparation at Lincoln College, Oxford, and completed a Master of Letters Degree at the Breadloaf School of English through Middlebury College in Vermont in 1981.

He has demonstrated his breadth of interest by serving as coach of the NNC wrestling program from 1983-85. He has been a member of the Modern Language Association and has served as an evaluator for the Idaho Shakespeare Festival's "Shakesperience" program. He was granted leave from 1987 until 1989 to pursue a doctoral degree, and received a Ph.D. from the University of Kansas in May of 1999.

Dr. Wenner has developed a reputation in his department as a champion of struggling students. He regularly holds individual conferences to address student questions, and is known for the quality and detail of his written comments on student compositions. Dr. Wenner continues to be strongly interested in poetry, both as a reader and writer. His poetic preferences lean toward Romantic and Victorian writers, including William Butler Yeats, William Wordsworth, Gerard Manley Hopkins and William Blake, after whom his son is named. His daughter Emily is a freshman at NNU. In this professional transition, Darryl hopes to dedicate more time to his writing.
